Our Mission: What We Most Believe

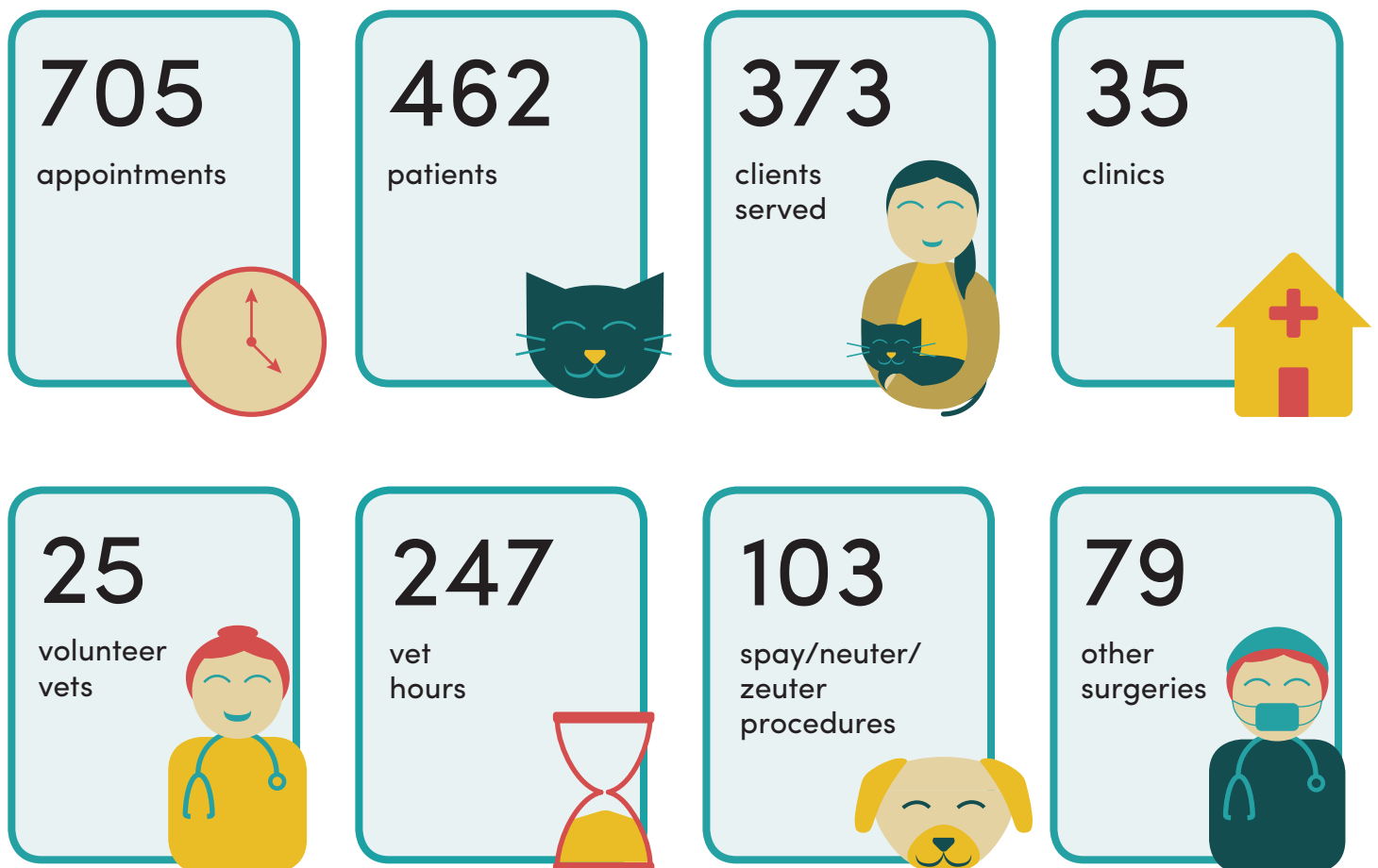
Our mission is to **save lives** and **reduce suffering** by providing free veterinary care to the pets of the homeless or those living in extreme poverty.

Our Vision: What We Strive For

We envision a community where no animal must suffer due to the owner's inability to pay for basic veterinary care. We believe everyone deserves the right to have an animal companion, but we also recognize the high costs associated with having a pet. Therefore, we break down the cost barrier for qualified clients to have a pet, keep their pets healthy, and reduce pet overpopulation through spay/neuter surgeries.

2016 in Review: By the Numbers

In 2016 we launched our new service delivery model of offering vet clinics on weekdays by appointment in addition to our monthly weekend drop-in clinics. With this new service delivery method, we offered 705 vet appointments, thanks to the generosity of 25 veterinarians that donated almost 250 hours of their time. Thanks to a partnership with Animal Aid, we developed the Canine Spay/Neuter in Portland Project and could spay/neuter 103 dogs. In addition, thanks to a generous grant from the Banfield Foundation we provided life-enhancing and lifesaving surgeries to 79 animals.



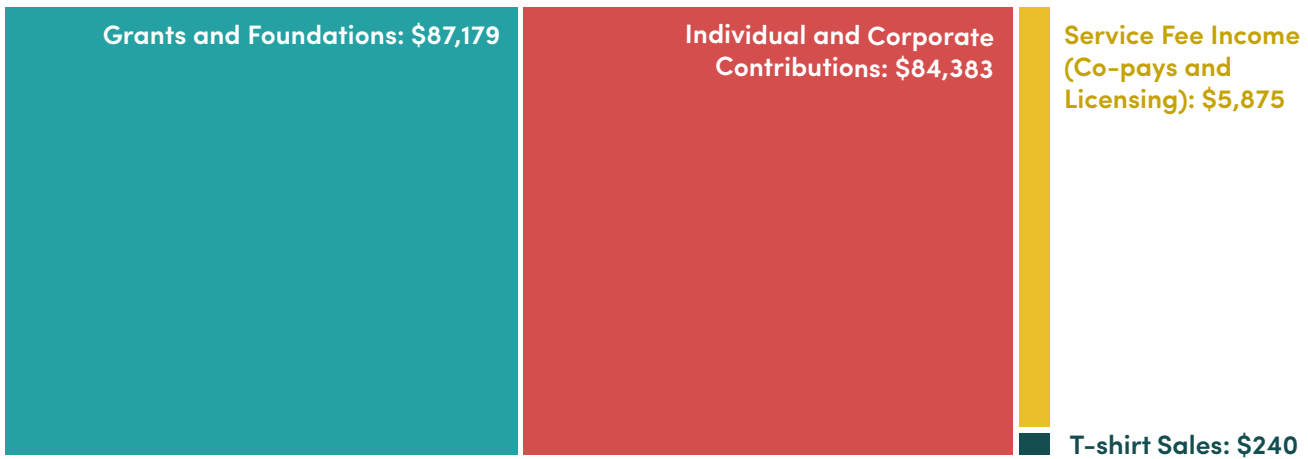
Financial Information

2016 was another successful year for PAW Team. Thanks to the generous support of our community members, we can better meet the growing demands for our services.

In 2015 our total income was \$149,432 and in 2016 that number grew to \$171,680, an increase of 15%. In addition, in 2015 our total expenses were \$117,793 and in 2016 that number grew to \$158,124, an increase of 34%. This increase allowed us to significantly increase staff hours and employee benefits, in turn expanding the services offered to the community.
